

2-4 Players

- Write five <u>clues</u> for each vocabulary word, without using the word in the clue. (Number them!)
- Clue ideas:
 - Definition in your own words
 - Synonyms & Antonyms
 - Examples
 - Part of speech

Ex.: gigantic

- 1. What we call a very big item
- 2. Humongous
- 3. The opposite of tiny
- 4. An elephant, for example
- 5. Adjective

- Game rules:
 - Player 1 chooses a vocabulary word (don't tell your partner!)
 - Player 2 chooses a number between 1 and 5.
 - Player 1 reads the clue with that number.
 - Player 2 guesses the vocabulary word. If correct, player 2 gets a point. If incorrect, choose another clue number.
 - Rotate players and repeat.
 - The player with the most points wins!

(played like 20 Questions)

- For each vocabulary word, write four sentences containing clues.
- Three of the sentences should be true, and one should be a lie.
- Take turns reading your partner your clue sentences.
- The listening partner must guess which sentence is the lie.
- Play continues until all words have been used.
- Examples:
 - 1. A synonym for gigantic is massive.
 - 2. I once ate a steak so gigantic it wouldn't fit on the plate!
 - 3. Gigantic is an adverb. (This is the lie.)
 - 4. There are gigantic cell phone towers near my house.

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
